President's Message

Get out the Vote!




Club Spotlight

September 6th- 8th, 2024

The Victory Dinner/ RPOF Quarterly was held in Hollywood, Florida. The Quarterly was quite informative. Many campaigning tips for the purpose of successfully supporting our future President Donald J. Trump, in addition to Senator Rick Scott, and local elections such as school board, and city council races, were shared. The proposed state amendments were reviewed. Please, it is imperative that you vote NO on Amendments 3 & 4. Help us spread the word! It is crucial that we keep Florida family friendly and free.

- 5. Annual adjustments to the value of certain homestead exemptions (based upon inflation)
- 6. Repeal of public campaign financing requirement (Applies to statewide races)

- 3. Adult use of marijuana (Children could still obtain this and the brain continues to develop up to age 26).
- 4. Limit Government Interference in abortion (Any "healthcare provider" could do an abortion)
