## 2025 Florida Legislative Session

### Top 10 Significant Bills Passed and Signed into Law

The 2025 Florida legislative session was one of the longest in recent history, extending into June due to budget negotiations. It resulted in approximately 269-285 bills passed, with a focus on public safety, education, health, environmental protection, taxes, and the state budget. Governor Ron DeSantis signed many into law, including a \$115.1 billion state budget (down from the previous year) and a major tax relief package. Below is a ranked list of the top 10 most significant bills based on impact, public attention, and scale (e.g., fiscal effects, statewide policy changes).

1. HB 7031 / **Tax Package** Provided \$1.3 billion in tax relief, one of the largest in state history, including permanent elimination of sales taxes on disaster preparedness items, health/safety products, and reductions on commercial leases. Signed as part of the final session actions.
2. SB 2500 / **General Appropriations Act** The \$115.1 billion state budget for FY 2025-2026, the first year-over-year decrease since 2011. Included funding for mental health, cancer research, education, and debt reduction (\$250 million allocated via HB 5017).
3. HB 1105 / **School Cell Phone Restrictions** Banned wireless devices (e.g., cell phones) throughout the school day for elementary and middle school students statewide; high schools retain class-time limits with a pilot for full bans in select districts.
4. HB 209 (or related) / **State Parks Protection** Prohibited developments like golf courses, pickleball courts, hotels, or similar in state parks, responding to public backlash against prior proposals.
5. SB 700 / **Fluoride in Public Water** Banned the addition of fluoride to public water systems, affecting community water fluoridation practices statewide.
6. **Condominium Relief** Bill Addressed the ongoing condo crisis by providing regulatory relief and measures to ease rising costs for owners (specific bill number varies in reports but highlighted as high-profile).
7. HB 1195 / **Gage's Law (Fentanyl Testing)** Required hospitals and emergency departments to test for fentanyl in suspected overdose cases and retain results.
8. HB 255 / **Dexter's Law** Increased penalties for aggravated animal cruelty (1.25x sentencing multiplier) and created a public animal abuser registry.
9. **Wrongful Death** Medical Malpractice Reform Lifted a 35-year ban on certain wrongful-death lawsuits against physicians and hospitals.
10. HB 1255 (or related to **education package**) Comprehensive education bill covering topics like opioid education, college cost awareness, and corporal punishment policies.
